Visa & Immigration Requirements

Foreign students must ensure they have the appropriate visa before arriving in South Africa. Students from most European and South American countries can enter South Africa on a tourist visa which they will get at the port of entry. For some countries, a **study visa** is required. To apply, students need:

- an acceptance letter from Cape Studies.
- proof of sufficient funds for tuition and living expenses.
- medical insurance valid in South Africa.
- a valid passport (at least six months beyond the duration of stay).

For visa extensions or renewals, students must apply through VFS, the by **Department of Home Affairs** appointed agent before their visa expires.

Health & medical assistance

Foreign students **should have medical insurance** before entering South Africa. Some key healthcare providers:

- **Private hospitals:** Netcare, Mediclinic, life healthcare.
- Public hospitals: Groote Schuur, somerset hospital.
- **Pharmacies:** Clicks, Dis-chem, and local independent pharmacies.

Accommodation options

Cape Studies provides limited on-campus accommodation, we also recommend:

Host families: experience local culture and practice English daily.

Student residences: shared accommodations for international students.

Private rentals: flats and apartments available in wonderful neighbourhoods like Green Point,

Sea Point, and Gardens.

Safety tip: avoid staying in remote or unfamiliar areas and always verify rental agreements before making payments.

Banking & Currency Exchange - Transportation & Getting Around



South Africa's currency is the **South African Rand (ZAR)**. Foreign students can:

- Open a local bank account at FNB,
 Standard Bank, ABSA, or Nedbank.
- Use international credit/debit cards (MasterCard & Visa widely accepted).
- Exchange currency at Bureaux de Change or major banks.
- Use ATM withdrawals, but be cautious in isolated areas

- MyCiTi Bus: The safest and most reliable public transport option.
- Uber & Bolt: Recommended for safe private travel.
- **Minibus Taxis:** Affordable, but not always safe for foreign students.
- **Car Rentals:** Available with an international driver's license.
- Airport Transfers: Pre-arrange transport for arrival in Cape Town.





Safety Tips & Cultural Insights

- Always carry a copy of your passport and visa.
- **Drinking age is 18**; avoid public intoxication.
- **Drugs are illegal**; South African laws are very strict.
- **Respect local customs and diversity**—South Africa is a multicultural society.
- **Emergency Numbers:** Medical (**10177**), General (**112** from mobile phones).
- South Africans value **Ubuntu** (human kindness and community spirit).
- English is widely spoken, but learning some local phrases (e.g., "Howzit?" for Hello) is appreciated.
- Tipping is customary: **10-15% at restaurants**, and **small tips** for car guards or service workers.



Weather & Packing Guide Social Integration & Extracurricular Activities

Cape Town has a **Mediterranean climate** with hot summers and mild winters.

- Summer (Dec Feb): Light clothing, sunscreen, and sunglasses.
- **Winter (Jun Aug):** Rainproof jacket, warm clothing.
- Spring/Autumn: Layers for varying temperatures.
- Always bring comfortable walking shoes for exploring.
